


# Still looking for that je ne sais quoi

## Assignments for Presenting Foreign Words and Phrases Used in English

Please choose one of the following and be prepared to present by \_\_\_\_\_



1. Create and record an interesting audio presentation that uses 30–50 words correctly and lasts fewer than five minutes. This can take the form of a sports show, talk show, drama, news cast, music program, awards show, anything that could be done on some audio app. You may include commercial breaks as well. Be sure the speakers can be clearly understood. If you use sound effects be sure they don't overpower the clarity of the text. Include a copy of the script. You may work in pairs or triads as well as individually on this.
2. Use 30 –50 words in some kind of visual such as a magazine spread, menu, newspaper page, comics, advertisement flyers, etc. You may make an original and/or replace existing words on a visual layout with your vocabulary words and phrases. Again, you may work individually, in pairs, or triads.
3. You may take a Little Golden Book or a well-known, classic children's poem and replace 30–50 of the words with appropriate choices from your vocabulary words. This would be a good choice for individual work or you could pair up for this.
4. You may do the Canard? or Crème de la Crème? poetry/translation assignment explained on a handout I will make available for you to look over. This one would also work well as an individual undertaking or with one other person.
5. You can record a video skit of some kind to present those words. Model on the Quack SAT vocabulary videos for the tone. You could insert music or video clips into your skits if you are a tech whiz kid.

6. You may present another idea of your choice to me as well. If it seems workable, I will probably tell you to go for it. As usual, be creative and have fun.

I have a basket of some samples of projects done way in the past by 7<sup>th</sup> grade gifted students at KMS. These will seem dated, perhaps, but will give you the general idea. You will probably do better!

Some helpful links are on the harrellland website (long term vocab) that can help with correct pronunciations.

I have also left out for you my set of illustrated vocab cards (envelopes) of these words and phrases that I want you to become extremely familiar with.

I imagine you might come across some foreign phrases in English Quizlets on-line if you search.
